A quarter of a century of stewardship for Bochum

Since 1999, we have played a key role in shaping policy at our City Hall.

We have shown what's possible when political responsibility is not avoided — but embraced.

In the past five years, we have, among other things:

- Reduced childcare fees by 25%. Now free up to €40,000 in parental income.
- Secured funding for welfare organizations and many social initiatives.
- For every felled city tree, two new trees are planted.
- Built nearly 100 km of bike paths.
- Introduced multi-year funding for the independent cultural scene, increasing annually by 1%.
- Significantly expanded solar panels on municipal rooftops.
- Redirected land policy: Priority for leasehold and best-bid procedures.
- Launched major projects for several thousand new homes.
- Built several new daycare centers.
- Approved: two new comprehensive schools, one new high school, expansion of secondary schools and more space in primary schools, two new sports halls, and renovation of all public pools.

We want the Bochum coalition to continue and for our city to keep being shaped progressively in the future.

€1 Billion for Childcare and Schools

Putting families first means investing in what matters: schools, childcare centers, sports facilities, and swimming pools.

Over the next ten years, we will invest around one billion euros to modernize and expand them. We're creating state-of-theart learning environments and supporting children through dedicated social work in both daycare and schools.

Shaping digitalisation — not just managing it

Digital transformation should empower people to help shape their city.
For example: a digital culture portal for Bochum that showcases all cultural players and offers, while also creating opportunities for networking.

We're making Bochum mobile: supermarket, park, school, or doctor everything should be reachable within 15 minutes.

5,000 new homes

Full speed ahead for more housing. We will close building gaps, add density, and extend existing buildings upward.

A major opportunity lies in renovating our ageing housing stock.

Where new construction takes place, we will ensure a high proportion of affordable homes — especially for families and people with limited mobility.

Through serial production and modular construction methods, new housing will be created faster, more resource-efficiently, and at lower cost.

Neighbourhoods worth living in

Everything you need for a good life is close by: health, sports, and cultural facilities, pocket parks, shopping opportunities, and public spaces free from the pressure to consume.

In local neighbourhood offices, you'll find a place to go for advice and support — whether it's the health kiosk, the seniors' office, help for newcomers, or guidance on the energy transition and building renovations in your district.

Climate neutral by 2035

To get there, we must:

- Drive the energy transition and heat planning locally.
- Harness district heating and geothermal energy.
- Install solar panels on every suitable roof.
- Stop soil sealing.
- Build sustainably.
- Switch to electric transport.
- Bring more greenery into our city.
- Collect organic waste citywide and introduce a municipal tax on single-use packaging.

We will expand Bochum's economic strengths in IT security and healthcare, while adding expertise in new sectors.

We support start-ups focused on climate protection, energy efficiency, and resource conservation — creating a true innovation hotspot for environmental technologies.

1,000 new trees — year after year

People who come to us generally want to integrate quickly — not wait endlessly. We will speed things up: appointment scheduling at the immigration office, application processing, recognition of qualifications, naturalisation, work permits, and German language courses.
